Scottish Impressions Childhood and Nature, the Path from Glasgow to Bougival

Inaugural exhibition of the Maison Berthe Morisot

The Maison Berthe Morisot in Bougival, France, will open its doors for the first time during the European Heritage Days on September 21 and 22, 2024, with an exhibition that offers a cross-cultural perspective between France and Scotland.

This exhibition celebrates two themes dear to the eponymous artist: children and nature, and establishes a close dialogue between a selection of Morisot's works, including some private loans, and original paintings from the Fleming Collection. Chosen from the works of the *Girls & Boys of Glasgow* movement this group of Scottish artists, who were heavily influenced by Corot and the Impressionists, reflects the teachings that Berthe Morisot and her sister Edma received from Corot during their youth. Artists such as Alexander Roche, fascinated by the wave of artistic innovation emanating from France, traveled across Europe to meet their counterparts and draw inspiration from their interpretations before introducing them to the Scottish and London art scenes. The juxtaposition that this offers provides a unique perspective on Morisot's innovative influence, techniques and themes, while highlighting the broader impact of Impressionism beyond French borders.



In the spirit of Impressionist innovation, *Scottish Impressions* is much more than just an exhibition. It is the starting point for a path that connects both a research program on the benefits of art and nature for global health, as well as online and in person international exchanges. This examination of the interaction between French and Scottish pictorial innovations provides an international insight into Impressionism and its enduring influence and impact on modern art and culture.

Berthe's Brush at Bougival (BBB) is a serious game designed to educate and raise awareness in reaching the exhibition with a scenography that associates Maison Berthe Morisot with the Ginkgo lab. park on the Colline des Impressionnistes. The game aims to encourage outdoor artistic expression and contribute to the well-being of the players. The young public will be particularly involved with the participation of schools from different countries. Each visitor earns tokens that allow them to compete and interact with other players. As they submit their pictorial creations, they are then integrated into an international online exhibition. Winners of the competition are selected by the participants, reminiscent of the Salon des Refusés. The BBB game will be accessible online in both French and English.

Berthe Morisot, the first female Impressionist, lived in Bougival where she experienced "the happiest moments of her life" and painted many works. The **Berthe Morisot museum space** is the only place exclusively dedicated to this major figure of Impressionism. It offers an immersive exploration of her life and work, allowing visitors to deeply discover the artist's universe. Enhanced with graphic and multimedia features, this space also aims to illustrate why Bougival was a source of inspiration for Impressionist artists, thanks to its landscapes along the Seine.

The Cornelius Arts Foundation, a British charity founded by Marianne Magnin in 2011, aims to develop research programs on the benefits that the arts bring to society. The strategic themes of R&D are education, global health, sustainable development, and innovation.
